The County will also be making \$75,000 for Township and Municipalities from the County Liquid Fuels Account. The County Commissioners have been sending County Liquid Fuels funds to Townships and Municipalities since 2008.

Bridge Inspections of closed bridge on Lockville Road, Exeter Twp. and Brides Drive Bridge deficiencies will be inspected on Wednesday.
